The Apostles' Creed

I BELIEVE in God, the Father Almighty, Creator of heaven and earth; and in Jesus Christ, His only Son, our Lord; who was conceived by the Holy

Ghost born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died and was buried. He descended into hell; the third day He arose again from the dead; He ascended into heaven, and sits at the right hand of God, the Father Almighty; from thence He shall come to judge the living and the dead. I believe in the Holy Ghost the Holy Catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and life everlasting. Amen.

The Our Father

OUR Father who art in heaven, hallowed be Thy name; Thy kingdom come; Thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread; and forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us; and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. Amen.

THE FAMILY ROSARY

*The Family That Prays Together . . .
Stays Together.*



THE Family Rosary is the Rosary recited *aloud together*, by as many of the family and their friends as can be present, or even by only two. Any family may say the Family Rosary in any suitable place and at any time.

A leader says aloud the first part of each prayer; a second person or group of persons answers aloud the second part of that prayer.

To begin the Family Rosary, all hold the Crucifix of their Rosary in the right hand and make the Sign of the Cross.

The leader begins the Apostles' Creed and proceeds to say the Our Father on the large beads and the Hail Mary on the small beads. The leader announces the Mystery before each decade. Five decades should be recited each day.

THE FIVE FIRST SATURDAYS

Mary's Great Promise at Fatima



THE Five First Saturdays are intended to honor and to make reparation to the Immaculate Heart of Mary for all the blasphemies and ingratitude of men.

This devotion and the wonderful promises connected with it were revealed by the Blessed Virgin at Fatima, a small village in Portugal. Our Lady appeared to three children there in 1917, and one of the little girls, Lucy, tells us that she said: *I promise to help at the hour of death, with the graces needed for salvation, whoever on the First Saturday of five consecutive months shall:*

1. *Confess and receive Communion;*
2. *Recite five decades of the Rosary;*
3. *And keep me company for fifteen minutes while meditating on the fifteen mysteries of the Rosary, with the intention of making reparation to me.*

In May 1930 Rev Father Goncalves instructed Lucia to answer the following question in writing. Q 4. Why should it be five Saturdays and not nine or seven in honour of the Sorrows of Our Lady ? Lucia answers :-

While staying in the chapel with Our Lord part of the night, between the 29th and the 30th of this month of May 1930, and speaking to Our Lord about question 4 I felt myself being more possessed by the Divine Presence, and if I am not mistaken the following was revealed to me:- “My daughter the motive is simple: there are five ways in which people offend, and blaspheme against the Immaculate Heart of Mary”

1. Blasphemies against the Immaculate Conception.
 2. Against Her Virginity.
 3. Against the Divine Maternity, refusing at the same time to accept Her as the Mother of all mankind.
 4. Those who publicly to implant in the children's hearts indifference, contempt and even hatred against this Immaculate Mother.
 5. By insulting Her directly in Her sacred images.
- “Here my daughter, is the reason why the Immaculate Heart of Mary (My Mother) causes me to ask for this little act of reparation and due to it, move my mercy to forgive those souls who had the misfortune of offending her...”

Said on Mondays, Thursdays, the Sundays of Advent and Sundays until Lent.

1. The Annunciation (Humility)
2. The Visitation (Fraternal charity)
3. The Nativity (Love of God)
4. The Presentation (Spirit of sacrifice)
5. Finding in the Temple (Zeal)

The Sorrowful Mysteries

Said on Tuesdays, Fridays and the Sundays of Lent.

1. Agony in the Garden (True Repentance)
2. Scourging at the Pillar (Mortification)
3. Crowning with Thorns (Moral Courage)
4. Carrying of the Cross (Patience)
5. The Crucifixion (Final Perseverance)

The Glorious Mysteries

Said on Wednesdays, Saturdays and Sundays from Easter until Advent.

1. The Resurrection (Faith)
2. The Ascension (Hope)
3. The Descent of the Holy Ghost (Zeal)
4. The Assumption (Happy death)
5. The Coronation of B.V.M. (Love for Mary)

I Desire True Repentance for My Sins

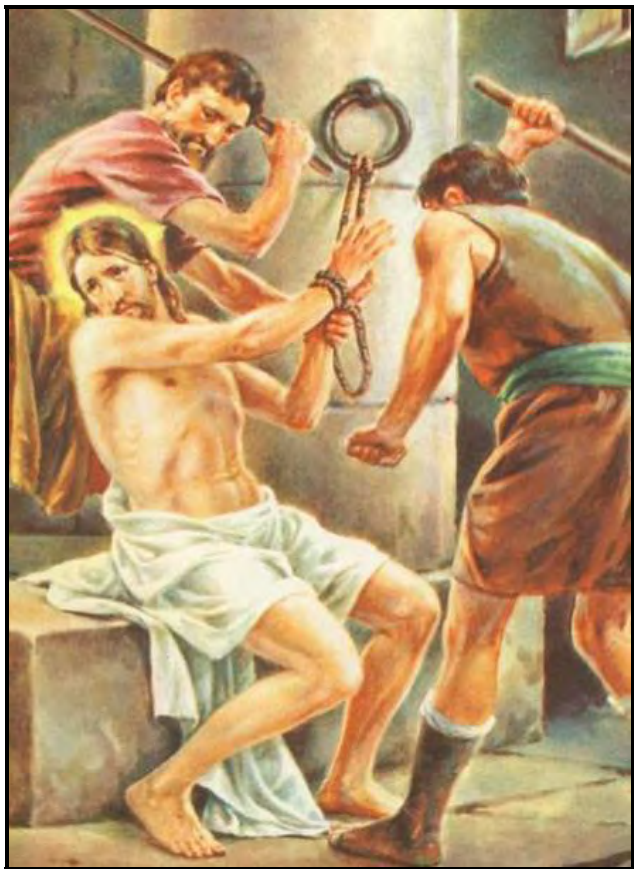
Think of . . .

Think of . . .

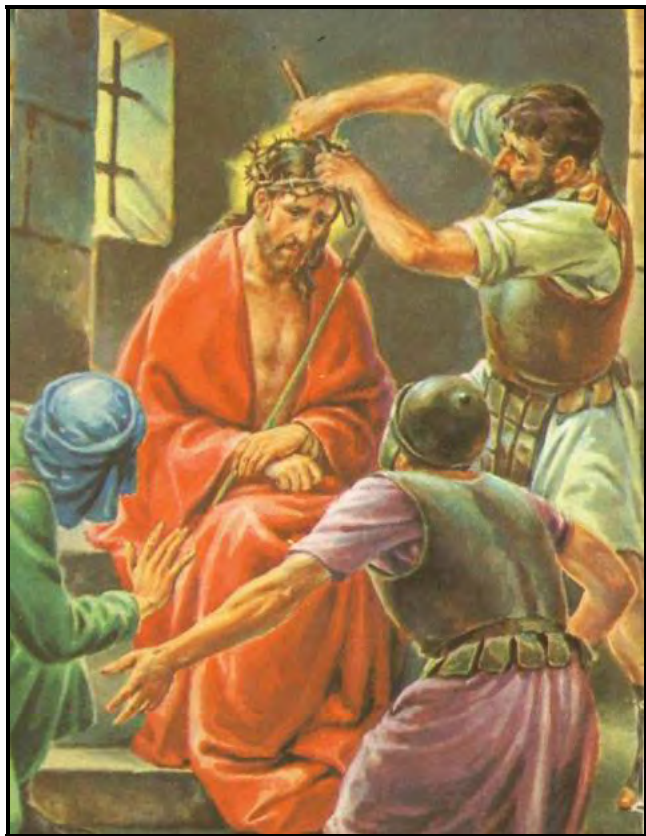
The cruel scourging at the pillar that our Lord suffered; the heavy blows that tore His flesh.

I Desire the Virtue of Hope

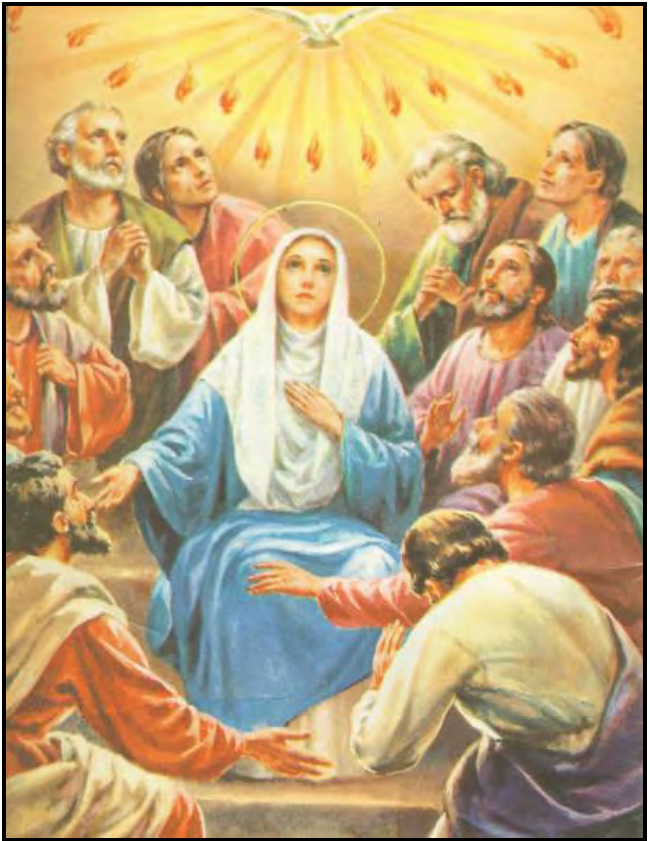
Think of . . .
